**Novena Prayer to Our Lady, the Immaculate Conception
November 30th – December 8th**

Most Holy Virgin, who was pleasing to the Lord and became His Mother, Immaculate in body and spirit, in faith and in love, look kindly on us who implore thy powerful patronage. The wicked serpent, against whom the primal curse was hurled, continues fiercely to attack and ensnare the unhappy children of Eve. Do thou, Mary, our Blessed Mother, our Queen and Advocate, who from the first instant of thy conception did crush the head of our enemy, receive these special prayers (*mention your requests here*) that we unite single-heartedly to thee and beg thee to offer at the throne of God. Help us, that we may never fall into the snares that are laid for us, and may all arrive at the port of salvation; and in the midst of so many dangers, may holy Church and the fellowship of Christians everywhere sing once more the hymn of deliverance, victory and peace. Amen.

**Advent Prayer – St. Andrew Christmas Novena
November 30th – December 25th (Said 15 times a day.)**

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was Born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour vouch safe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior and His Blessed Mother. Amen.

Indulgences for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

On all the days from November 1st through November 8th inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. (Only one plenary indulgence can be gained per day.)

Conditions for both indulgences:

1. It is necessary to be in the state of grace, at least by completion of the work.
2. Freedom from attachment to sin, even venial sin, is necessary; otherwise the indulgence is only partial. (By this is meant attachment to a particular sin, not sin in general)
3. Holy Communion must be received each time the indulgence is sought.
4. Prayers must be recited for the intentions of the Holy Father on each day the indulgence is sought. (No particular prayers are prescribed. One Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or other suitable prayers.)
5. A sacramental confession must be made within a week of completion of the prescribed work. (One confession made during the week, made with the intention of gaining all the indulgences, suffices).
